Drawing: Growing artists

Unit outcomes



Pupils who are secure will be able to:

- ✓ Know the difference between organic and geometric shapes.
- ✓ Use simple shapes to form the basis of a detailed drawing.
- ✓ Use shading to demonstrate a sense of light and dark in their work
- Shade with a reasonable degree of accuracy and skill.
- ✓ Blend tones smoothly and follow the four shading rules.
- ✓ Collect a varied range of textures using frottage.
- ✓ Use tools competently, being willing to experiment.
- Generate ideas mostly independently and make decisions to compose an interesting frottage image.
- ✓ Make considered cuts and tears to create their ideas.
- ✓ Understand how to apply tone, with some guidance about where to use it.
- Draw a framed selection of an image onto a large scale with some guidance.
- Try a range of drawing materials, beginning to demonstrate expressive marks by trying tools in an interesting way.



History

British history 1: Would you prefer to live in the Stone Age, Bronze Age or Iron Age?

Kapow His Unit outcomes

Pupils who are secure will be able to:

- Understand that prehistory was a long time ago.
- Accurately place AD and BC on a timeline.
- Identify conclusions that are certainties and possibilities based on archaeological evidence.
- Explain the limitations of archaeological evidence.
- Use artefacts to make deductions about the Amesbury Archer's life.
- Identify gaps in their knowledge of the Bronze Age.
- Explain how bronze was better than stone and how it transformed farming.
- Explain how trade increased during the Iron Age and why coins were needed.
- Identify changes and continuities between the Neolithic and Iron Age periods.
- Explain which period they would prefer to have lived in, providing evidence for their choice.

Science— Rocks



This unit on 'Rocks' takes children through six lessons where they learn how to compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. They learn how to describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock and finally they learn how to recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.





We are going on a school trip on Friday 29th September to Creswell Crags to further develop their knowledge in this topic.
