To kick off the term, we'll delve into 'The Eye of the Wolf'. Throughout this unit, students will unleash their creativity by crafting alternative endings, as well as delving into the art of monologues and recounts.

In addition, this term will see our writing and grammar sessions intertwine with the world of visual literacy! Students will embark on a journey to master the art of writing flashbacks inspired by captivating video clips from beloved films like Ratatouille, Coco, Piano, and Finding Nemo, among others.

Furthermore, students will sharpen their skills in spelling, punctuation, and grammar in preparation for their upcoming SATs.

But that's not all! Alongside our writing endeavours, our guided reading sessions will immerse students in a rich tapestry of fiction, poetry, and non-fiction texts. Here, they'll not only learn, but also showcase their prowess in prediction, comprehension, and summarization through various engaging activities.



Maths

We will be following the Powermaths programme, which challenges and stretches children's thinking and skills in mathematics. The units we will cover this term include::

- * Measure
 - * Ratio

The children will also be revising for their SATs- focusing on all the methods they have learned and applying this to a range of problems.

Science

Evolution and inheritance.

This unit introduces the children to the key concepts of evolution and inheritance by building upon previous topics, including animal characteristics and fossils. The children will learn about inherited traits and apply their knowledge to various animals and plants, before being introduced to the work of Mary Anning and Charles Darwin. Through the presentations and tasks, the children will learn about the fascinating history of the human race and discover links between extinct animals and those which are still living today.

Re - Is Christianity still a string religion?

Music - Film music
