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Dear Parents/Guardians

Reading is a skill we continue to develop throughout our lives, but starting this process as early as possible has significant benefits for our continued success as readers. This is why, as parents and carers, you play a vital role in supporting your child in becoming a fluent reader who is confidently able to apply his or her reading skills across all areas of their lives.

The teaching of reading and reading comprehension within the classroom is only part of a child's learning, and the value that is given to reading at home is equally important. Research suggests that children who read regularly outside of school gain greater confidence in many other areas of the curriculum and as such support at home is essential in ensuring that your child makes the progress we know them to be capable of. You can help your child to achieve their full potential by listening to them read daily if possible. This could include reading regular bedtime stories alongside reading the books brought home from school. Reading widely will help develop your child's vocabulary, which in turn will make them more confident and get them ready to read a wider variety of more challenging books.

Giving your child a choice over what they read is an important factor in boosting their enthusiasm for reading and children are more likely to be interested in books they have selected for themselves. Your local library is an incredibly useful resource in providing regular reading material for your child and best of all – it's free!

To help us track how much reading your child is are doing at home, it is important that you sign their reading record every time you have listened to them read, along with a brief comment. At the upper end of Key Stage 2, when children are more likely to be reading with confidence and fluency, they should be keeping their own daily records, which should be signed by parents/carers at least once a week.

Your support with reading at home is essential and only by working together can we ensure your child achieves their potential as a reader. If you require any further guidance regarding reading, please ask your child's class teacher.
